


## In Case you Missed It...

## Virtual Drive-In A Success

Thank you to everyone who participated in the virtual drive-in. From the welcome to the round tables, the day was spent in lively discussion and engaged learning. Attendance was widespread with participants attending from 14 of Iowa's 15 community college districts.

Some session highlights included a discussion with the Human Resources panel on employee conflict and relations and how COVID has caused institutions to look at work from home policies. Greta Giese explained the importance of self-care in regards to Social/Emotional, Financial and Physical Wellness while also wowing many participants with the usefulness and fun of the Zoom annotation feature. Eastern Iowa's afternoon sessions explored institutional vs state data on gender and race which sparked much self-reflection and raised many questions on how colleges approach these populations. Clinton Community College's [RISE](#) program addressed how they're providing intensive advising support to these populations as well as other at-risk student groups. The sub-group roundtables finished out the day and continue to be highlight for many participants.
